



### GLUES – Science-Policy Interface and International Conventions

#### What is the Science-Policy Interface and why do we offer support in work with international conventions?

The science-policy interface is meant to facilitate the transfer of results into international policy processes (e.g., CBD<sup>1</sup>, UNFCCC<sup>2</sup> and UNCCD<sup>3</sup>) and their scientific advisory bodies (SBSTTA<sup>4</sup>, IPCC<sup>5</sup>, the forthcoming IPBES<sup>6</sup>) and transport policy makers' needs and views into the scientific community of the funding measure Sustainable Land Management.

#### GLUES Science-Policy provides and delivers:

- Preparation of workshops where the respective topics of the upcoming meetings as well as the ways to participate as a scientist are presented.
- Help with presentations at side-events and discussion forums, drafting of background papers (e.g., so-called information documents) or contribution to publication series.
- Arrangement and facilitation of such side-events.
- Participation in the meetings as such and putting forward project results at the sessions of the respective subgroups.
- Feedback from the political meetings is delivered via different channels including workshops, reports, the newsletter and personal briefings.

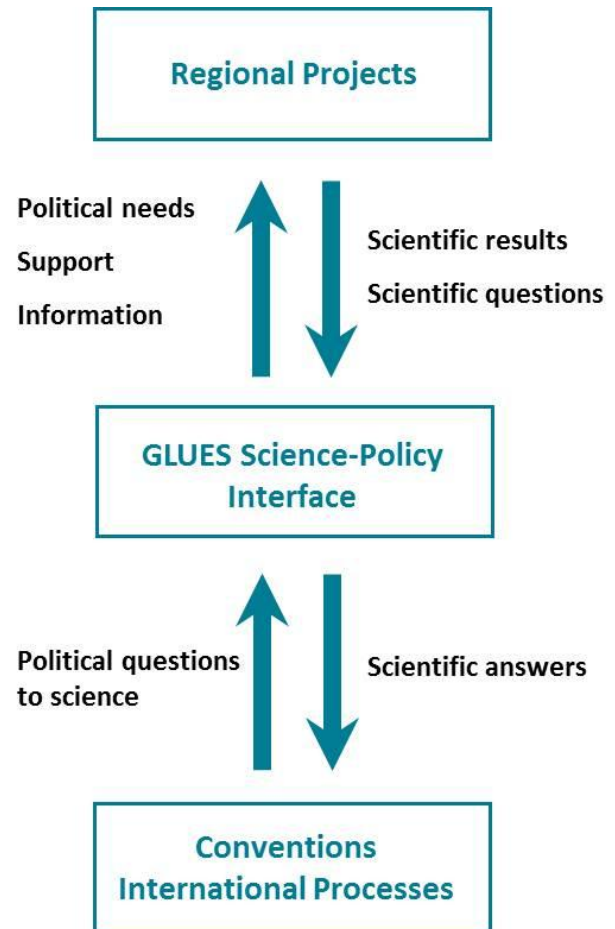
